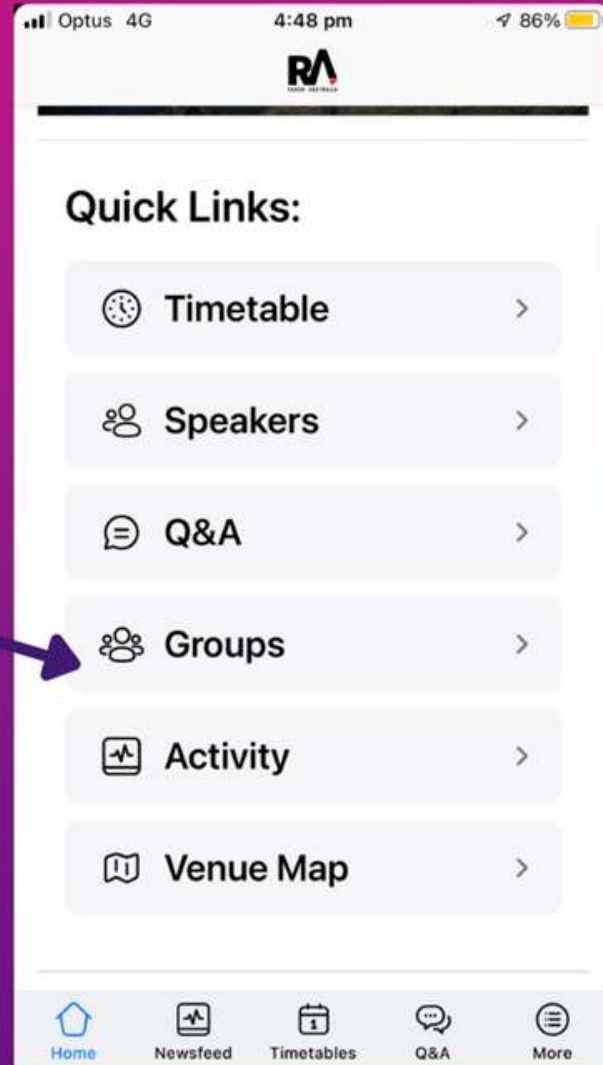


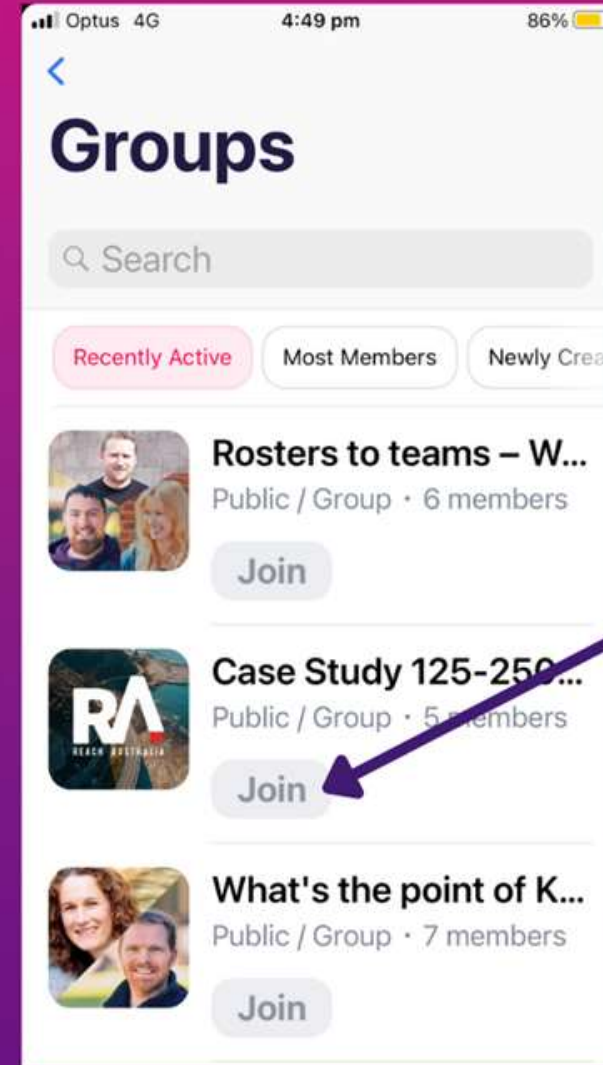

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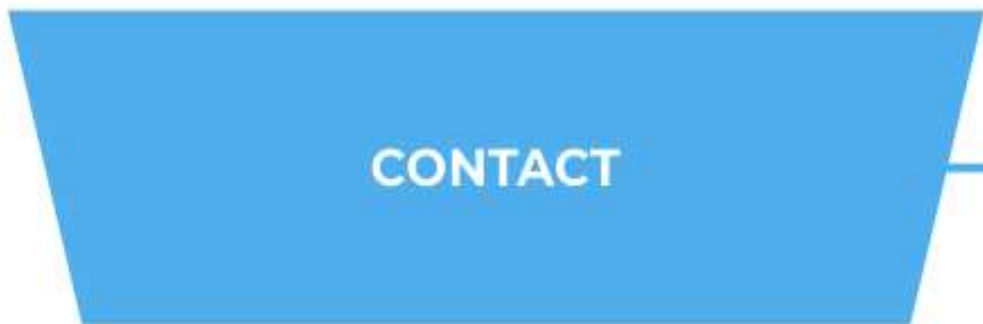

# Mission Champion: Role Description

Last updated: 17th September 2021

## Position Details

Role Title: Mission Champion

Department: Mission Team

Reports to: Mission Pastor

## Role Overview

The role of the Mission Champion is to work towards **creating a culture of evangelism** within their congregation as part of the broader strategy for Mission at HBC.<sup>1</sup> A culture of evangelism is created by building the flocks...

- Conviction: passion for seeing people won to Christ
- Competence:
  - Individually - skills, knowledge and abilities in evangelism
  - Corporately - maximising the way we work together as Christ's body to take out the gospel
- Confidence: that God *is* and *will* use us to save people.
- Connection\*

It is worth noting that this is not done in isolation. To be a mission champion at a campus/congregation is to be a part of the overall team of mission champions across HBC who are working together for the same end and purpose.

## Primary Responsibilities

The Mission Champions responsibilities are to...

### a. Pray

This is the fundamental responsibility of the Mission Champion. Because it is God who builds His church, the most powerful thing we can do as His children is *ask* Him to use us. So the number one ministry of the mission champion is to pray for the lost of our city, nation and world, and to pray for our church to grow in it's passion for mission.

### b. Assess & Dream

One of the key responsibilities of the mission champion is not just to 'work in the ministry' but also to 'work *on* the ministry'. At times the mission champion with the help of the Mission Pastor will need to 'pull-back' from the day to day life of mission within their Campus to assess how we are really going at building a culture of mission and dream about ways we can do it better. This means that the mission champ will constantly be looking for both weaknesses and opportunities when it comes to the mission culture of HBC.

### c. Generate

The final primary responsibility of the Mission Champ is to generate mission culture and heat. To a large extent this is done through resourcing and supporting key culture creating structures across HBC to ensure they are rich with Mission DNA.<sup>2</sup> However given the limited and often competing air space within these structures, the Mission Champ will also create mission culture through mission specific structures.

## Key Tasks<sup>3</sup>

In order to fulfill their primary responsibilities, the key tasks of the Mission Champ are to...

1. Produce and deliver mission content
  - a. 2 Mission Videos for use on Sunday/Comms/GG's
    - i. 1 x Conversion Story
    - ii. 1 x Evangelism Story
  - b. 1 Book Review
2. Organise and oversee Mission Advocates
  - a. Appoint Mission Advocates in each GG within your congregation
  - b. Train and Equip them in the role
  - c. **Feed information/content to them every 2-3 times per term regarding Mission<sup>4</sup>**
3. Coordinate HBC Mission Nights (Salt + Light) + Dinners for Evangelists
  - a. Each semester a mission night will be delegated to one of the mission champs to oversee (on a rotating basis). The mission champ who oversees the Mission Night must coordinate the execution of the Mission Night through delegating responsibilities to the other Mission Champs
  - b. Each Mission Champ must also organise 1 Mission Dinner per semester

<sup>2</sup> Key Culture Creating Structures at HBC include but are not limited to: Sundays, GG's, Church Camps, Communications.

<sup>3</sup> These tasks will be built into Asana for accountability purposes

<sup>4</sup> There is a key area of overlap with the Global Mission Team here. Since Mission Advocates help GG's build a culture of local and global mission they necessarily will need input from both Mission Champs and the Global Mission Team. Therefore the Mission Champ needs to liaise regularly with the Global Mission Team in order to feed the Mission Advocates relevant Global Mission information and content.

<sup>1</sup> The broader strategy for Mission at HBC is that we would be a people God uses to reach Newcastle & Lake Macquarie, Australia and the world with the gospel of Christ.

## Unichurch GG Mission Advocate Role Description - 2022



### Vision for Unichurch

Our vision is that Unichurch would **reach the lost** of the University of Newcastle & beyond and would be **equipped** and **passionate** about personal and global evangelism.

### Goal for GG Mission Advocates

To **advocate** for **local** and **global** mission within your Growth Group ... In other words, **PUMP** up your group about the *joy, urgency and excitement* of Mission.

### Role Description - What it looks like in action!

- **Organise** to run a 'Mission Spot' (10-20mins) in your GG every 3 weeks.
  - Get in touch your GG leaders to arrange a time
  - Read the Mission Mail that the Mission team will send. This will outline the content of each 'Mission Spot' - use this to prepare your Mission Spot. It will include things like facilitating prayer times, discussions, sharing about missionary partners and more!
- **Sign up** to receive your [GG's missionary partner's](#) prayer letters
  - Plus, throughout the year write to them as a GG (reminders to do this will be included in the Mission Mail).
- **Be missional yourself**
  - PRAY - for yourself, for your group, for reaching the lost in your life, on campus, in Newy and beyond.
  - Be growing in your own passion and skills in evangelism. Lead the way in taking 'one next step' outside your comfort zone for Jesus.
  - Think about and share any possible evangelism applications that may arise during Bible studies, or ways that you can encourage or start conversations about evangelism over GG dinner or times outside the formal mission spot.
- **Be a part of the team**
  - Attend Mission Advocate Team get-togethers (TBC but probably ~once per term)
  - Report back to the Team Leader with how things are going



**PUMP** up your growth group about the *joy, urgency and excitement* of **mission**.
